Microsoft Exchange 2007 Multi-Tenant Hosting - Hide Email In Global Address List - GAL

Summary

Multiple hosted exchange organizations on single Exchange server is called multi-tenant Exchange hosting. In multi-tenant exchange hosting the address books and organizations should be separated and hidden from each other. The article discusses how to achieve this.

Machpanel only facilitates hosted email service provisioning and management on Microsoft Exchange 2007. There is separate service preparation procedure to prepare your active directory and Exchange server to host multiple organizations. The following Microsoft whitepaper describes shared hosting scenario where multiple companies are shared using the same Active Directory domain and can interoperate with each other.
